

Coronavirus Vaccine Information

Fauquier Health is working closely with Fauquier County, the Town of Warrenton, Fauquier County Department of Fire, Rescue and Emergency Management, and the Rappahannock-Rapidan Health District of the Virginia Department of Health to set up and maintain a local phase 1b vaccination clinic.

Eligible community members can visit the Rappahannock-Rapidan Health District's website to learn how to register, or click on the link below to pre-register through the new statewide system at: vaccinate.virginia.gov.

All individuals who have previously filled out a vaccine survey or signed up for a wait list to be vaccinated through their local health district will be automatically imported into the new statewide system. Individuals will maintain their current status in the queue, and will be able to search that they are in the new system.

What are the Benefits of Getting the Coronavirus Vaccine?

- The Coronavirus Vaccine has been proven to be highly effective protecting against COVID-19.
- The Coronavirus Vaccine has been evaluated in clinical trials and has been proven to be safe.
- The Coronavirus Vaccine will protect others around you. It is important to be protected particularly if you are around people at increased risk for developing severe illness. Some people who are at increased risk for severe illness include the elderly and people with other underlying medical conditions.
- The Coronavirus Vaccine creates antibodies (immune system response) without having to become sick with the COVID-19.
- Wearing masks, washing your hands, and social distancing can help protect you from COVID-19, but this is not enough. Along with masking, washing your hands and social distancing, getting vaccinated offers you the best protection from getting seriously ill from COVID-19.
- Experts have concluded that the Coronavirus Vaccine will help reduce the transmission of the virus with our communities.

Coronavirus Vaccine Frequently Asked Questions

Who qualifies for the 1b vaccine?

Frontline Essential Workers, Persons 16-64 with Underlying Medical Condition, Persons Aged 65 years and Older, and People Living in Correctional Facilities, Homeless Shelters or Migrant Labor Camps.

Is there a charge for the vaccine?

No, there is no charge for the Coronavirus Vaccine.

Will I get COVID-19 from the vaccine?

No, the vaccine will not give you COVID-19.

What are the side effects of the vaccine?

The most common side effects of the vaccine are pain at the injection site, fatigue, muscle aches and sometimes fever but these side effects will subside. Your vaccination center will provide additional information when you get your vaccine.

How many shots do I need?

Two shots are generally needed. These are given weeks apart. Your Vaccination Center will provide you with additional information about when and where to get your second shot.
